The Risk Management Coordinator is responsible for the organization's Illness and Injury Prevention Program, safety training, and loss-control programs. The Coordinator will travel extensively throughout Los Angeles County to investigate incidents and claims, make recommendations to improve workplace and school safety, and reduce risks for the organization. Additionally, the Risk Management Coordinator develops and trains employees on procedures to ensure a safe work and school environment during normal and emergency situations. The coordinator will also serve as the ADA Title II Coordinator to ensure the organization's compliance with the Americans with Disabilities Act. An ideal candidate will be technology-savvy and familiar with computer applications commonly used in the risk management field.
